They have spent several years gaining a Christian education to strengthen their faith and prepare for a life in ministry. Having preached in over 400 churches within the United States, the organization has extended its reach and is influencing communities around the world. These communities range in location from Benin, Botswana, Israel, Jamaica, Kenya, South Africa, Tanzania, Togo and the administrative headquarters in Zimbabwe.

VISION

MISSION

Through the support of visionaries, HFAN will establish a hope center for training people in several vocations and ministries.

ZIMBABWE CULTURE

The culture of ignorance has kept Zimbabwe from reaching its full potential. Ignorance within the country of Zimbabwe impacts the health of the people, and hinders spiritual progression.



HEALTH

There is a low life expectancy due to disease and the lack of knowledge of germs and proper hygiene. Without being taught the moral code of abstinence, an HIV/AIDS epidemic has erupted. Many suffer an early death, leaving children displaced. Lives and family structures have been destroyed, forcing orphans into lives of crime, slavery, and prostitution to survive.

Economic upheaval and lack of rural development are the cause of change within family structures. The younger generations must leave for the city to pursue its educational and employment opportunities in order to make a life for themselves. An example of this would be learning the trade of irrigation and farming practices so the nation can feed itself.

SPIRITUAL

Ignorance of biblical teaching affects the moral fiber of the whole nation, leading astray its people and its leaders. It affects every facet of society.

Women participate more in churches and other organizations which allow them to make contributions and feel equal within the group and society as a whole. In effort to find equality in society,

Biblical instruction would develop a foundation of a moral code for society, self-worth for all individuals, and a realization of the potential they hold within. The ethical advances that would develop would heal families, politics, and change society as a whole.

It's not that biblical teaching isn't familiar, but more so that the initial presentation of the Gospel was distasteful or unclear. The people have mixed Christianity with their core belief system that includes witchcraft and ancestral worship.

When an individual gets sick, the whole family may go through a cleansing ritual to chase away any evil spiritual forces and to appease ancestral spirits. Sometimes in these practices, healing effects of medicinal herbs are mistaken as answer to prayer or from the Shona healer. Proper medical care aside, the practice of witchcraft and speaking to the dead are strictly opposed in Christianity. The two beliefs coexist, yet the mixture is not possible.

EVENT OPORTUNITIES

Ministry in Churches - To bring revival to churches that are hungry for more of God and have a desire to reach new levels in their relationship with him.

Crusades - To reach the lost in urban and rural areas.

Prayer and Fasting Conference - To build up strength in current Christian leaders to prepare the nation for the gospel

Leadership and Pastors Conference - To encourage current Christian leaders

Kids Crusades - Explaining the love of Christ to kids who have not heard it before.

Business Seminar - To train men and women in skills to help earn a living that will counter the high unemployment rate in Zimbabwe.

Marriage and Family Conference - To build strength in the bond of marriage and teach biblical family principles people can use to strengthen their family bond.

Ladies Conference - To encourage and empower women in the lord. Provide information on healthy living and ministry in churches.

Equipped Youth Explosion - To ignite a flame for Christ in the young adults of the nation.

Understanding the proverb “knowledge is power,” Zimbabwe will be able reach its potential. Education within the country of Zimbabwe will impact the health of the people, reduce government corruption, and develop spiritual progression.

In order to address these problems, HFAN organizes several successful events in Zimbabwe since 2003. During a five week period in the summer, mission teams of about 14 people travel to Zimbabwe to help minister to the people through church services, specialty conferences and crusades. The events are specifically tailored to cover a variety of topics in order to help the most amount of people have their lives changed through Christ.

Although these methods are successful, they are on a short-term basis. HFAN has a heart to do more but lacks the facilities to sustain long-term ministry. It is financially impractical to minister without a base of operations in the country. By creating a base of operations for HFAN in Zimbabwe, the ministry will affect spiritual, social, and economic change throughout Africa and the world. Through a strategy based on empowering the individual to articulate change in their own life and in society, the culture in Zimbabwe can be repaired and the nation as a whole benefit.

HOPE CENTER SOLUTION

The plan is to build a headquarters for the ministry in Zimbabwe called the Hope Center. The building will facilitate the direct needs of HFAN and disciple those who wish to be further trained in ministry. The volunteers and missionaries who travel to Zimbabwe will use the Hope Center as a training center and resting place. From there, they will go out to conduct conferences, seminars, and crusades at neighboring churches.
